



WHAT IS PEACEWORKS UNIVERSITY?

PeaceWorks University is our online membership site, which exists to train and support people helpers in a variety of ministry contexts to address domestic violence with the gospel of peace.

PeaceWorks University has two main components: education and equipping through our online membership site and community building, peer support, and networking through our private PeaceWorks University Facebook Community group. Members of PeaceWorks University will receive access to the regularly released resources below:

NEW! BI-MONTHLY SHEPHERDING TEAM ROUNDTABLE VIDEO

In January, March, May, July, September, and November of 2023, PeaceWorks University members will receive access to bi-monthly videos highlighting one of six potential shepherding team components through interviews with a diverse group of lay & professional helpers. These components will include:

- -- Pastors
- -- Advocates
- -- Counselors for Victims
- -- Counselors for Perpetrators
- -- Men of Peace Facilitators
- -- Trauma Healing/Post-Traumatic Growth

BI- MONTHLY TOOLBOX

In January, March, May, July, September, and November of 2023, PWU members will receive access to bi-monthly practical, ready-to-use Toolbox items (in addition to the vast archive of past Toolbox items). These Toolbox items will correspond to each of the six Shepherding Team Roundtable videos.

NEW! BI-MONTHLY SHEPHERDING TEAM OPEN CONSULTS

In February, April, June, August, October, and December of 2023, PWU members will have the opportunity to participate in bi-monthly Zoom calls with Chris Moles for Shepherding Team members engaged in current domestic abuse intervention cases. These open consults will take place on the second Wednesday of the month at 12pm EST and will not be recorded or be available for later viewing.

MONTHLY MEMBERS ONLY LIVE Q&A

Each month throughout 2023, PWU members will have the opportunity to participate in a live Q&A with Chris Moles (via Zoom) on the first Wednesday of each month at 12pm EST. During these one-hour private Q&As, PWU members may submit questions pertaining to domestic abuse prevention and intervention. These Q&As will be recorded and saved in both our private PeaceWorks University Facebook Community group and the PeaceWorks University membership site for later viewing.

In addition to each of these regularly released resources, PWU members will have access to any 2023

Webinars with Chris Moles hosted on our Podia page AND they will have full access to our online membership site which includes a vast archive of BONUS content, our CORE CURRICULUM for perpetrator confrontation (The Heart of Domestic Abuse: Step by Step Abuser Intervention for Biblical Counselors), past skill building SUCCESS PATHS and TOOLBOX items, as well as recordings of all past MASTER CLASSES, MEMBERS ONLY LIVE Q&As, and BOOK CLUBS.

*IS PEACEWORKS UNIVERSITY FOR VICTIMS OR PERPETRATORS OF ABUSE?

PeaceWorks University is our online membership site, which exists to train and support people helpers in a variety of ministry contexts to address domestic violence with the gospel of peace. <u>PeaceWorks</u> <u>University does not offer victim support services nor does it act as a recovery program for abusive men.</u>

A Word to Victims/Survivors of Domestic Abuse

Because of the limited parameters of our ministry, we recommend that women currently suffering under the weight of abuse first seek out victim-specific support and advocacy services (please contact us for a list of such resources). On occasion, victims/survivors of domestic abuse do choose to join our PeaceWorks University membership site in order to educate themselves on the dynamics and impact of abuse and to receive training on how to come alongside other women in abusive relationships. While victims and survivors are welcome to learn within our membership (and we especially value what we can learn from them!) the membership site will not function as a victim support ministry for them but is primarily educational in nature. PeaceWorks is unable to provide such members with any kind of individual support, advocacy, counsel, or case management. We also urge all victims/survivors within our membership to exercise caution and discretion when participating in any of our live (Zoom) resources or when interacting within the PeaceWorks University Facebook Community Group.

A Word to Perpetrators of Domestic Abuse

Because of the limited parameters of our ministry, we recommend that men desiring to take ownership of their abusive behaviors and surrender themselves fully to the Lord in true and lasting repentance not join PeaceWorks University but instead take advantage of our *Men of Peace Self-Paced Course* which is designed exclusively for such men (visit www.menofpeace.org for more information).

If a known or disclosed abuser does choose to join PeaceWorks University, their participation will be extremely limited. In order to maintain a safe and secure learning environment for our members, we do not permit abusive or even recently recovering men to join the private PeaceWorks University Facebook Community group or to participate in any of the live (Zoom) resources (such as our Q&As or Shepherding Team Open Consults). Abusive men who join PeaceWorks University do have access though to all other non-live resources housed within the PeaceWorks University membership site (including recordings of past and future Q&As and past Book Clubs), with the understanding that these resources are for general education purposes and are not intended as a recovery tool. PeaceWorks is unable to provide such members with any kind of individual support, coaching, counsel, or case management.
